



English Grammar Definitions

Complete Sentence	What makes a COMPLETE SENTENCE? 5 parts you need. (1) A capital letter at the start. A (2) subject and (3) verb at the heart. (4) Punctuation at the end. (5) Does it make sense? Then my friend, you've got all 5 parts of a complete sentence.
Parts of Speech	8 Parts of Speech: Noun, verb, adjective, adverb, pronoun, preposition, interjection, conjunction
Noun	A NOUN is the name of a person, place or thing, activity or idea.
Verb	A VERB is a word that shows action, a state of being, links 2 words together, or helps another verb.
Adjective	An ADJECTIVE modifies a noun or pronoun by describing, qualifying, or limiting. It answers the questions: What kind? How many? Which one? Whose?
Article Adjectives	ARTICLE ADJECTIVES: a, an, the
Adverb	An ADVERB modifies a verb, adjective or another adverb. It answers the questions: How? When? Where? Why? How Often? How Much? To What Extent? Under What Condition? Words that end in -ly are usually adverbs. Not & never are always adverbs.
Pronoun	A PRONOUN replaces a noun in order to avoid repetition.
Subject Pronouns	Subject Pronouns are used as a subject: I, you, he, she, it, we, you, they
Preposition	A PREPOSITION relates a noun or pronoun to another word.
List of Prepositions	Aboard, about, above, across, after, against, along-- amid, among, around, as, at, atop, before-- behind, below, beneath, beside, between, beyond, but, by--, concerning, down, during, for, from, in, inside,-- into, like, near, of, off, on, onto-- out, outside, over, past, since, through, throughout-- to, toward, under, underneath, until, unto-- up, upon, with, within, without
Conjunction	A CONJUNCTION is a joining word, connecting words or phrases or clauses together.
Coordinating Conjunctions	FANBOYS are the coordinating conjunctions. For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So
Interjection	An INTERJECTION is a short exclamation to express strong emotion. Wow! Oops! Amen!
