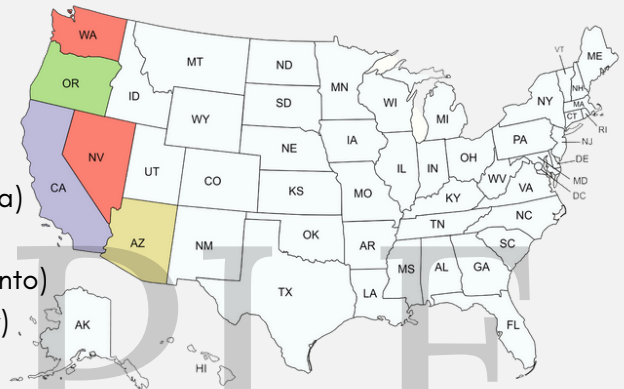

observe, question, research, hypothesize, test, conclude, report.

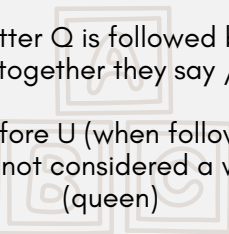


SPELLING RULE

Therefore U (when following a Q) is not considered a vowel (queen)



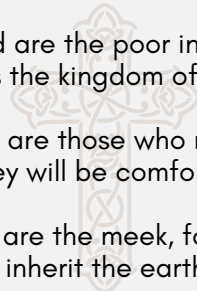

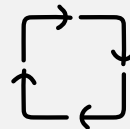
